

Number 4 is the correct answer.

When you are backing up to the sled you should accelerate slowly, watch to make sure you don't hit anyone, and stop before you hit the sled.

This is done correctly most of the time. We appreciate it, for the safety of our workers. Standing all day and bending over to hook tractors to the sled, is a very hard job. The last thing they need is to worry about getting pinned between a tractor and the sled. I personally think that anyone who doesn't backup safely, should be made to do the job for a few hours.
